Virtual University of the Baltic Sea Region

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION

WHAT IS IT?

Virtual University of the Baltic Sea Region (Virtuelle Hochschule Ostseeraum, VHO) is an international, cross-institutional and interdisciplinary project that aims to establish a new virtual learning environment at the University of Greifswald and promote collaboration between the universities in the Baltic Sea region.

WHAT IS IT FOR?

The aims of the project are the next

- improvement and specialisation of courses for master students and advanced teacher programs;
- qualification of academic teachers for the purpose of English virtual learning environments;
- international connection of virtual learning courses and therefore specialisation of courses for the research emphasis on the Baltic Sea Area.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The teaching and learning activities take place in the **shared digital space**. Lecture and seminar formats are designed jointly by an international team of teachers from partner universities. Students can engage themselves in self-study with units accessible online (*asynchronous teaching*), online sessions with all students and teachers (*synchronous teaching*) as well as **self-planned group work** in international working groups. The students are accompanied by the teachers in cooperative projects, and research-based learning is a central component of the courses. If the travel situation allows, the course is rounded off by a one-week excursion.

WHO CAN BENEFIT FROM IT?

Students

- Students who need more courses in English for their curriculum international students, students of foreign languages, just any ones who would like to have more practical experience in English
- Students who need online courses for their personal circumstances: relocation, disability, sickness, parenting, or caring for a family member.
- Students who would like to get more international experience in study, especially those limited in the opportunity for physical study exchange abroad.

Academic staff

- Those who would like to advance innovative digital teaching methods and experiment with digital tools and their potential for new pedagogic approaches.
- Those who would like to advance their teaching in English and for a diverse international audience, especially those limited in the opportunity to have physical international teaching experience.
- Those who would like to extend professional networks with the partners and collaborators of the VHO.
- Those who would like to enrich their study programs and modules with innovative international courses.

WHO ARE THE PARTNERS?

The project was founded by history professors from four Baltic universities: **University of Greifswald, Stockholm University, Tampere University and St. Petersburg State University** (cooperation with St. Petersburg State University was suspended since the Russian *invasion of Ukraine*). Now there is ongoing work on the collaboration with the **University of Szczecin**.

The project is open to new partnership proposals and ideas!

HOW TO PARTICIPATE?

- Offer the international course to your students: include it in the curriculum of your university or check other available forms of student participation and accreditation.
- Contribute a video lecture and seminar working package (source text and/or research paper on the chosen topic with a set of questions for the work with the texts).
- Read a guest lecture for the course participants and wider audience online or in presence, in hybrid mode.
- Open your online courses or other educational events to students from partner universities.
- Participate in the collaborative development of the new VHO modules
- Offer your idea for the new collaborative module and find collaborators in the project network.
- Join your own project on international digital education to the framework of the VHO with mutual benefit.
